Office of Fair Trading warns against Queensland scam operator

THE QUEENSLAND

OFFICE of Fair Trading (OFT) has issued a formal warning not to deal with the Gold Coast-based company Little Boy Press, or its owners Phillip Conquest and Bruce Pollard.

OFT executed three search warrants last month on business and residential premises associated with the business.

Fair Trading executive director Brian Bauer said Little Boy Press had allegedly engaged in invoice fraud by billing for services it never supplied.

"The target of the scam was asked to sponsor a local

community organisation or business by paying for the printing of materials in exchange for an advertisement," Mr Bauer said.

"In one case the scammers used the name of a local bowls club and the lure of an advertisement placed on the club's scorecards. The victim paid Little Boy Press for the printing of the scorecards, but they were never supplied.

The scam was uncovered when the victim asked a legitimate member of the bowls club how the scorecards were being received by members, only to discover the bowls club had no knowledge of the supposed scorecards."

Mr Bauer said the OFT was seeking information from any community organisation or business who has had dealings with Little Boy Press or its owners.

"It's possible there are a number of victims who are unaware they have been scammed," he said.

Invoice fraud or false billing is a common scam often characterised by fake advertising directories or products.

"If you receive calls seeking payment, always double check that you have actually ordered and received the advertising service," Mr Bauer said.

"These scammers prey on time-poor business owners who assume that another staff member placed or authorised the advertising service.

"Sophisticated scammers will even offer to send copies of the advertisement, but providing one copy of an advertisement doesn't prove it was printed and distributed.

"Never pay an invoice unless the person demanding payment can prove you authorised it."

Affected businesses can make a complaint via the OFT website.
